## ABOUT BLESS

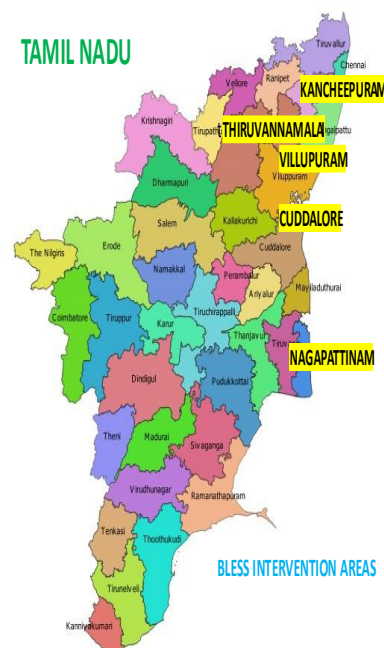

**FFVDP (Family Focused Village Development Program)**

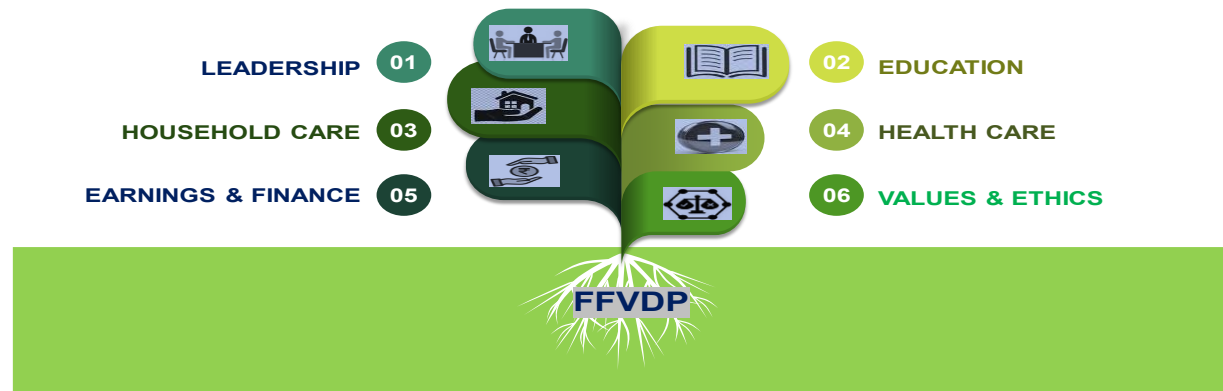

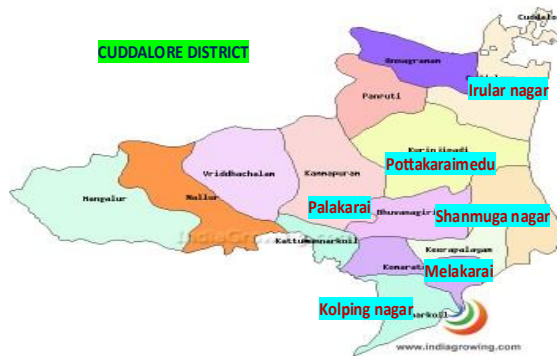

## MISSION TOPIC 01:

### LEADERSHIP

**MISSION:** Families and communities have increased capacity to access and enjoy their rights and entitlement to develop their village holistically and equitably.

#### ACTIVITIES PLANNED:

Village Development Committee's exposure visit to LITDS, providing chairs to VDC, conducting cluster level meetings and Contributing to the government for road connectivity.

- Meetings of village development committees were held every month in all the villages, where, among other things, the main discussion was around the aspects of the mission.
- Cluster-level meetings with the participation of all 6 village VDC members were held on 28<sup>th</sup> June 22, 24<sup>th</sup> September 22, 28<sup>th</sup> December 22, and 18<sup>th</sup> March 23. Knowledge and bottlenecks were shared and the beneficiary for credit support was selected during the meeting.
- Refresher training for the members of the Village Development Committee on the FFVDP mission topics took place on various dates for each village. Viz) Irular Nagar: 25-01-2023 & 18-02-2023, Kolping Nagar: 28.01.2023 & 14.02.2023, Melakarai: 09.09.22 & 25.01.2023, Palakarai: 30.09.2022 & 25.02.2023, Pottakaraimeedu: 11.10.2022 & 21.12.2022, Shanmuga nagar: 12-12-2022 & 28-01-2023.
- The Family Development Group (FDG) in each village met every month and whenever needed and had discussion on issues related to the intervention topics (family issues, entitlements to be reached for each family, financial issues etc).
- 10 chairs were provided to all the Village Development committees except Melakarai to enhance their office functional ability.
- Shanmuga Nagar, Pottakaraimeedu and Kolping Nagar villages have road facilities connecting their villages with the nearby main road. Some of the members of all villages who had been left out from entitlements have obtained their entitlements like Aadhaar card, community certificates, old age pension, inclusion in MGNREGA scheme etc. Families in these villages had obtained land titles, household electrification and drinking water facilities.

## PROGRAM REFLECTIONS



### BEGINNING OF A NEW HOPE

My self Indhira living with my family in Pottakaraimeedu. I am the second wife of my husband. I have two children and one out of them is mentally retarded. Due to misgiving, as a reactionary gesture, my husband did not allow me to speak to anyone in the village. Our family members did not obtain any government entitlement. On such course, the regular house visits of the staff of FFVDP program, made me to come out of the restrictions imposed by my husband. I was also taught about the importance of obtaining the Government entitlements. As a reaction, I approached the line departments concerned on my own and obtained all the entitlements including the disability certificate for my daughter. I have also obtained the death certificate of my husband who passed away during the month of June 2022.



### **A HAND OF HOPE**

My name is Arikeshmani, a resident of Shanmuga Nagar. I am 28 years old and a member of VDC. I have always had the desire to help and improve my community. Being a member of VDC, I took the chance to materialize my desire. Being a member, I took the initiative of obtaining community certificate that in which the members of my village faced difficulty to access. With the support of fellow VDC members, I helped those deserving and needy to apply for the community certificate online. I went to Taluk office in this regard for follow up and explained in detail for the query made by the officials. Through these activities 80 of my villagers got community certificate. Now I am sure our community can access any scheme that in which helps them to have a good life.

## MISSION TOPIC 02:

### EDUCATION

**MISSION:** Rural children and youth have quality education, with employable and leadership skills resulting in decent and dignified employment and/or self-employment.

#### Activities planned:

Providing book rack to remedial centres, electrification of remedial centres, remedial children training material (cursive notes), talent contest for remedial class children, library renovation, education tour to planetarium, nutritious snacks to remedial class children, Breakfast provision to school children in Irular colony & Shanmuga nagar, providing cycle for school going children in Pottakaraimedu, common toilet and extension of remedial centre remedial centre in Pottakaraimedu, providing sports materials to the youth of Pottakaraimedu, Vocational training, fencing and gardening of library entrance, training the youth in animation by DBRITE and adult literacy training program.

- Balwadi centres in Kolping nagar and Melakarai got new enrolment with 11 children. Nutritious food provided to the new incumbent and all the children of six villages.
- Balwadi in shanmuga nagar had been renovated and equipped with necessary materials.
- Old balwadi building in Shanmuga nagar repaired and converted into library setup.
- Breakfast (Idly) provided to all 77 remedial class students of Shanmuga nagar, Melakarai & Irular colony.
- Remedial classes functioned six days in a week. Remedial class specific syllabus had been prepared and enforced to teach and analyse the reading, writing, speaking and comprehensive skills of the children. Nutritious food such as groundnut cake, sesame cake, green gram provided to all the 139 remedial class children across the program villages. The children were oriented on vegetable garden.
- Writing materials (Cursive note) provided to 129 children in all villages.
- Remedial class children in Irular colony, Palakarai, Pottakaraimedu were provided with a total number of 294 books containing the life history of National leaders, word dictionary, moral and story books. The newly setup library in Shanmuga nagar was provided with 36 books containing the life history of National leaders, word dictionary, moral and story books.
- For the sake of learning new things and knowledge development, 135 children were taken to various places in Pondicherry (Arts & crafts village, Pondicherry airport, science centre, beach etc)
- 46 children participated in talent show contest and prizes were distributed to the winners.
- Reading and writing skills literacy imparted to 91 adults. The Shanmuga Nagar remedial centre which consists of 31 adults were supported with teaching and learning materials by the Government of TN.

- 40 bicycles were provided to the school going children in Kolping Nagar, Pottakaraimedu and Shanmuga Nagar
- 27 students who had been absent for a long time were counselled and sent back to school. Enabled 2 Undergraduate students and 2 Post graduate students to avail scholarship.
- Enabled 2 college dropouts to re-enrol in their respective colleges.
- In coordination with DBRITE an awareness cum motivational program for 42 youth from all villages had happened on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2022 at DBRITE campus
- Youth clubs in Shanmuga Nagar and Pottakaraimedu were offered sports materials such as football, volley ball, throw ball, carrom, ring ball, etc.

## PROGRAM REFLECTIONS



### FEELING LIKE A COMPLETE MAN

My name is Susairaj. I belong to Kolping nagar and the current leader of the Village Development Committee. Although I did not know to read or write and sign as well, the people of my village made me the Leader of the Village Development Committee. But I had the longing to get a basic literacy skill. My desire and longing to get the basic reading and writing skills ended at the FFVDP adult literacy program. I regularly attended the adult literacy program and eagerly learnt. The capacity training and many meetings made me learn more. With that curiosity, I learn to sign and was in the process of reading. Now as a VDC leader, I used to meet MLA, Counsellor, VAO, BDO, and RI for Road Connection, Water facilities, toilet construction, Patta, and street light. Though I'm the only male member in the VDC, villagers used to say that I simply take the VDC women here and there just for nothing. But now we have made a road connection for our village with the help of FFVDP. We are working on getting tar road facility for our village and hope we will achieve it soon.



### **TOWARDS TIREDLESS BETTER EDUCATION**

Myself Ashwin aged about 17 and living with my parents in Kolping Nagar. My parents are daily laborers. My school is situated 4 kms away from our village and I had to walk for nearly half an hour to reach the school daily on school working days. For this reason, many days I did not attend the school and so faced scolding from my parents. Walking one hour up and down daily gave me leg pain and made me tired which did not allow me to concentrate on my studies. Hearing and observing this issue, the FFVDP staff took steps to ease my transit to school. As a result, I got a bicycle from the FFVDP. Now I am going to school every day with a reach in 10 minutes that in turn helped me to concentrate on my studies.

**MISSION:** Families live in a safe and secure life, clean and green environment and have food security.

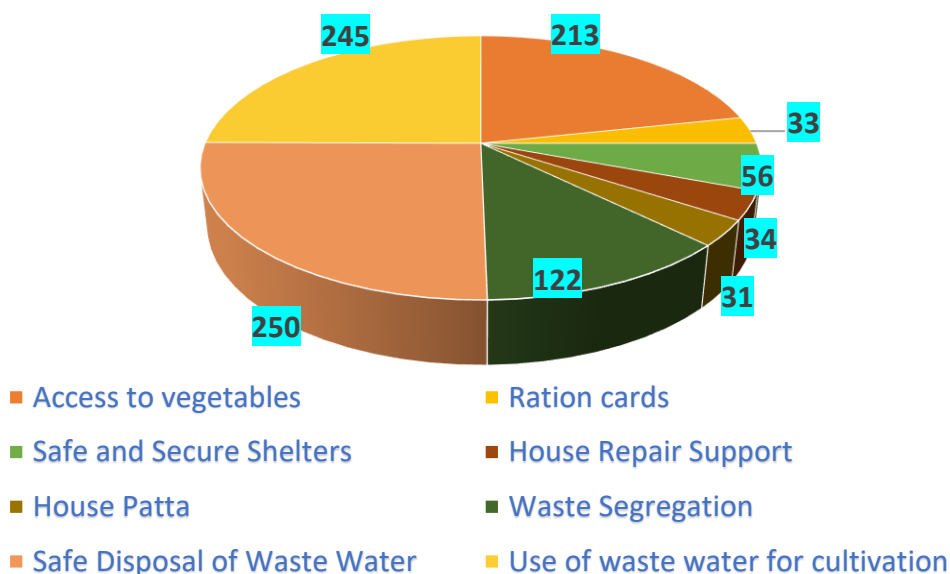
#### ACTIVITIES PLANNED:

Conducting food mela, Distribution of seeds, grow bag and plant saplings, Shelter repair activities.

Amount Allotted	Rs. 4,88,340
Amount Spent	Rs. 4,85,440

- Kitchen garden vegetables distributed to each family and awareness created on the consumption of vegetables
- Food mela on traditional food to showcase the cooking talent of women conducted in each village and participants trained on the preparation of nutritious food. The toppers were distributed with prizes.
- 19 varieties of seeds and plant saplings such as tomato seed, brinjal seeds, cluster beans, ladies finger, radish, 6 varieties of lettuce, beans, snake guard etc distributed to each household and different variety seeds were sowed in the common kitchen garden.
- Efforts made and administrative sanction order received for the construction of 14 houses
- In Palakarai, one beneficiary constructed his house until window level with the Government support and laying foundation was supported with Rs. 20000/ by FFVDP.
- 10 poor conditioned shelter roofs had been repaired in Shanmuga nagar.

### HEALTHY AND SATISFIED LIFE

My name is Vasantha, living with my husband in Pottakaraimedu. My two sons were married and living in an outside area. We have not had a single plant in our own space around our home and it looked very vague. In this scenario, FFVDP staff looking after our village distributed us vegetable and fruit seeds to nurture around my house. Along with the seeds bought on my own, I sowed all those received seeds in our own space and taking proper care. Now my garden has 11 varieties of plants and trees such as yam, pomegranate, mango, papaya, amla, guava, banana, eggplant, tomato, chili, moringa, sugarcane, and all types of lettuce. We consume the vegetable grown in our garden and also share the excess to our fellow villagers. Having a well grown garden gives me satisfaction. I feel proud that I can able to contribute to my society and spreading the greenery towards environmental

## MISSION TOPIC 04:

### HEALTH CARE

#### MISSION:

Families have safe water, functional toilets, practice hygiene behaviour including menstrual and reproductive health

#### ACTIVITIES PLANNED:

Installation of hand pump, Installation of water tank with pipeline, awareness creation on menstrual health and hygiene, toilet construction with the government funding support, repairing hand pump

- 22 families in Irular nagar got household drinking water connections under the Jal Jeevan mission.
- 55 toilets in Pottakaraimeedu had been renovated, 10 out of this repair work was supported directly by the FFVDP and other 45 toilets were renovated through local contribution.
- 168 women and adolescent girls were oriented on menstrual health and hygiene. Making reusable sanitary pads were also taught to the participants.
- Community in all the villages were sensitized on WASH behaviour and water handling techniques.
- Remedial centre students in Shanmuga nagar and Palakarai. were sensitized on the

- One time a month health check-up visits made by Village Health Nurses
- 1 common drinking water tank with 1000 litres capacity installed in Kolping Nagar
- 1 existing common toilet in Pottakaraimdu had been renovated and in use.
- 8 Government (Rs.12000) cum FFVDP (Rs. 5000) supported toilet constructed in Shanmuga Nagar.
- Family Development Groups trained in water handling and hand washing techniques in all villages
- 18 participants (both men and women) of Palakarai were trained on solid waste management

## PROGRAM REFLECTIONS



### A PATIENT TURNED HEALTH ADVISOR

My name is Kanniparuvam and I hail from Pottakaramedu. Years back BLESS helped me to build a household toilet. Despite having a toilet, I never used it and accustomed to open defecation. Even though my children insisted on using the toilet, I never listened. As a result, I got health issues such as fever, headache, stomach pain, and body pain all at a time and became bedridden. I had been admitted to the hospital. The doctor's report mentioned it as an intestinal infection caused due to open defecation. I was forced to avail revolving fund from the VDC to meet out the medical expenses. Later I fully understood what the staff said about the necessity of using the toilet and started using it. Few months back my household toilet has been repaired with the support of FFVDP fund. I am now using the toilet regularly and also advising the adults in our village to use the toilet.

## **MISSION TOPIC 05: EARNINGS & FINANCE**

**MISSION:** Families have sustainable and decent income and do safe and productive investment

**ACTIVITIES PLANNED:**  
Livelihood support (goat & Quail) and livestock training and creation of livelihood support fund

<b>Amount Allotted</b>	<b>Rs. 7,32,559</b>
<b>Amount Spent</b>	<b>Rs. 6,38,655</b>

- 11 families bought 5 goats each, 11 families got a dairy cow and 1 family got a cow with a calf. One family assisted to start small snack unit (murukku business).
- Livestock and disease management training delivered to the livestock beneficiary.
- Families in all the villages were visited and sensitized on financial literacy
- Revolving fund and livelihood support reflects in the economy of the families. Savings become regular among the SHG members. SHG members save Rs. 100/ per month which improves their group savings and number of members accessing revolving fund. The group savings of two SHGs in Kolping nagar has gone up as one of them the





SHG have Rs.11,400/- as savings and the other has Rs. 1,60,000/- as savings.

- VDC Revolving fund resulted in clearing debt and further improves their family income.



#### External Loan Repayment

Impact of Revolving fund and Livelihood support: Loans taken from private moneylenders were repaid that results in fall in debt burden for 25 families

#### Savings

Impact of Revolving fund and Livelihood support: Monthly savings of 71 Self Help Groups and/ Family Development Groups have increased

#### Financial Literacy

Impact of Financial Literacy: Smart handling of earned money among 176 families. Responsible spending increased with preplanned budgeting to achieve seemingly unachievable goals.

## PROGRAM REFLECTIONS

### **A RELIEF THROUGH HANDS ON SUPPORT**

Myself Rajamanickam hailing from Palakarai. My wife is a physically challenged person (deaf). We have no children and was depending only on the income from Old Age Pension scheme. I used to save Rs.200/ month in FDG with that income. I am chronic to asthma and so often fell sick. I had availed the livelihood support from the FFVDP project previously. The support I availed helped me to earn income. Now the severity of my sickness increased and could not get rid of it. To cure my ailment, I took Rs. 5000/ loan from the FDG savings. I had again been supported by the FFVDP with the livestock (goat) assistance. Now both the livelihood support and the loan I took from the FDG helps to get health treatment and to run my family life in a smooth way.

## PROGRAM REFLECTIONS

### A LIFE CHANGING DAWN

Myself Bilal a resident of Shanmuga nagar village. I am 45 years old, married and having three children. I was a chain smoker and used to have alcohol daily. My addiction to drugs created havoc in my family. My children used to beg me to quit and free from such habits. But I never listened to them and continued my habits. Meanwhile the VDC had been dissolved as a follow up to the quarrel between the VDC and the Village Panchayat. This time the staff of FFVDP took steps to recreate the VDC. Then it has been recreated by the FC & CO with new members. I used this chance and volunteered to take up the Earnings & Finance member position in VDC. Since then, I stopped consuming the alcohol and smoking. Being a member of the VDC, I wanted to show that I am a responsible person and worked hard towards a role model for others. I am now working hard towards making my village as a model village.

## CHILDREN'S HOME AND CHILDREN ACTIVITY CENTRE

**Objective:** Providing Shelter, Food, and Education to Orphan and Semi-Orphan Children.

**Partnership:** Collaborative effort with Les Amis des Enfants du Monde (AEM), France.

**Impact:** Nurturing vulnerable children in the Cuddalore District, ensuring their holistic development.

### Key Activities:

- Educational Program with Residential Care for Orphan and Semi-Orphan Children at BLESS Children's Home, Reddichavadi Village, Cuddalore District.
- Empowerment and Protection of the Rights of Dalit and Tribal Children through Meaningful Education and Community Participation at Children's Activity Centre.



### BLESS Children's Home:

The Home provides shelter, food, and education to orphan, semi-orphan, and BPL children. Thirty students were reunited with relatives, while 13 remain under our care. We actively monitor their progress and ensure holistic development through moral sessions, counselling, and regular gatherings.



### **Sponsorship Programme:**

Forty deserving children were sponsored, covering their educational fees. Organized get-togethers served as platforms to review progress and motivate students, fostering a supportive network for the sponsored children.







### Children Activity Centres - Tamil Nadu:

We conducted remedial classes for underperforming students and supported the "Illam Thedi Kalvi" initiative by providing assistance to children and encouragement to teachers.



### Children Activity Centres - Pondicherry:

Five centres were established to provide after-school support to tribal students, focusing on education, art, culture, counselling, and nutritional assistance. Robust monitoring ensures effective implementation.





## INLAND CYCLE FISH VENDORS EMPOWERMENT

### Project Focus:

The project aims to "Improve and Sustain the Income of Inland Fish Vendors" by addressing the challenges they face, particularly those exacerbated by climate change.

### Approach:

The primary strategy involves forming Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) and providing essential resources to enhance livelihoods.

### Target Population:

Marginalized fishing communities experiencing difficulties due to climate change.

### Key Activities:

#### Capacity Building Training:

- Conducted four times annually covering project objectives, climate change adaptation, and leadership.
- Participants received materials, accommodation, and travel allowances.
- Formation of 35 new JLGs with training sessions on cooperative operations and government schemes. consisting a Total Number of 525 Fish Vendors.
- Financial support provided to JLGs.



#### JLG Executive Committee:

- Ensured diverse representation with 10 women and 5 men.
- Organized bi-annual capacity building sessions.
- Managed resources and facilitated strategic planning.





### Water-Bodies Lease Assistance:

- Financial aid extended to three beneficiary groups to diversify livelihoods and enhance economic resilience.



### Livelihood Support:

- Essential items provided to 245 fish vendors in Mettupalayam, including ice boxes, raincoats, torches, weighing machines, solar dryers, and customised cycles.
- Working conditions improved, and product quality enhanced.





### **Exposure Visits and In-house Training:**

- Two-day visits equipped fish vendors with essential knowledge, including practical training on solar dryer functions, ice cube production, and digital weighing machines operation.

### **Prototype Fish Vending Two-Wheeler:**

- A battery-operated vehicle designed for fish vendors, with exploration of credit linkages with NBFCs for affordability.



### **Fish Vendor Identity Cards:**

- Issuance of Government-Identity Cards to create inclusivity and access to welfare schemes.



#### Accident Insurance:

- 245 fish vendors are covered by accident insurance through LIC, with monthly premiums paid by BLESS.

#### Loans under PM FME Scheme - UCO Bank:

- Loans provided for Technological advancements and Business expansion.

#### Meeting with Cabinet Minister:

- Discussion held on compensation for fish vendors during lean periods, with assurances of necessary action and consideration for compensation.



#### Loan Sanction for Mini Truck Purchase:

- JLG Bharathiya secured a loan of INR 14 Lakh with a 60% subsidy for a four-wheeler.

#### Addressing Alcoholism among Vendors:

- BLESS initiated community-based programs and established a De-Addiction Centre.

**Significance:**

- Focus on sustainable livelihoods, institutional strengthening, climate resilience, financial inclusion, policy advocacy, safety, empowerment, and awareness among inland fish vendors for systemic change and long-term impact.

**Project Name:** Elderly Care Support

**Location:** Ottampattu Village, Gingee Tk, Villupuram District, Tamil Nadu, India

**Initiatives:** Providing support to elderly individuals in need of food, medical care, and personal attention.
